Earning this designation is tantamount to having the words *summa cum laude* emblazoned on an instructor's certificate. These Masters truly represent the *crème de la crème* of the aviation education industry! In the near future, the website of SAFE, the Society of Aviation and Flight Educators (www.SafePilots.org) will publicly recognize these individuals and their noteworthy accomplishments.
